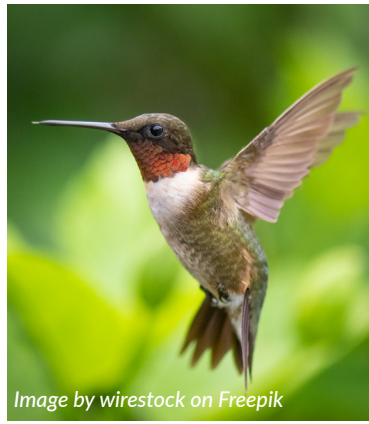


Why are **Native Plants** so important?

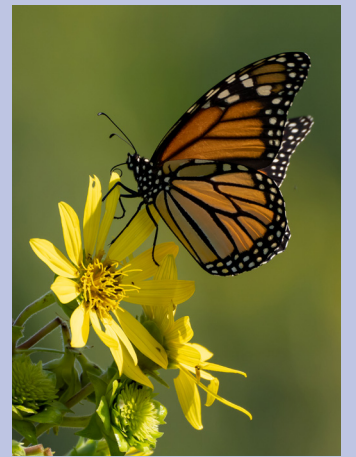
To save our planet, we must protect our water, air, & soil.

Native plants have evolved over thousands of years alongside native bees, birds, and wildlife.

The intricate relationships between flora and fauna are extremely specialized and cannot be replaced with non-native plants.



Our landscapes today often contain plants collected from around the world, but many of our insects and caterpillars have not evolved quickly enough to be able to eat these strange, exotic foods.

Incorporating lawns and so many non-native plants into our landscapes has caused a sharp decline in pollinators and wildlife species, in part, because of a lack of food.
